

# TRIBUTE TO A FRIEND, A NEIGHBOR, A FOUNDER OF BCP

On April 14 Ed Koren died at the age of 87. The world knew him as the celebrated cartoonist for the New Yorker magazine, whose shaggy creatures brought a smile to everyone's face, along with keen insight into the vagaries of life. Ed drew his remarkable cartoons up until the end.

However, his neighbors in Brookfield knew him as the cyclist whom we passed in our cars as he pedaled his way up and down our hilly roads and around Sunset Lake – almost daily.

Ed was known and admired for his thirty years of service as a volunteer fire fighter. No matter what the season, in all kinds of weather and at all times of day or night, he donned the gear, boots and hat to save a neighbor's home or barn from destruction.

Way back in 2002 Ed was a member of the original group of neighbors, who decided to buy the historic Brookfield Old Town Hall, when the private owner put it up for auction. That huge leap of faith lead to the formation of the Brookfield Community Partnership, which restored the building and created our vibrant community center. Ed served on the board of BCP for many years.

Thank you, Ed, our good friend and neighbor.
